Matt also covered different sites that sell coins and this created a short discussion about buying premiums adding to the purchase cost and driving down the value of coins as people pay less when they know there is also a premium.

The club also has a member who they sponsored that is working for Heritage Auctions. Zeke Wischer, 22, of Abilene, Kansas was hired as a cataloger at Heritage Auctions in Dallas, Texas where he started as a PNG intern on February 15, 2014.
